

HOME PROGRAM ELIGIBLE PROGRAM TYPES

- Homeowner Rehabilitation
- Homebuyer Programs
- Rental Housing
- Tenant-Based Rental Assistance



HOME PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

- Acquisition (of standard housing)
- Rehabilitation
- New Construction
- Tenant-Based Rental Assistance

This is the framework through which all HOME activities should be viewed





HOME PROGRAM ABSOLUTES OF HOME

- Income Targeting eligible beneficiaries
- Affordability correct rents or resale/recapture provisions for required period of affordability
- Standard Condition decent, safe, and sanitary units




CDBG PROGRAM PRIMARY OBJECTIVES

 CDBG - To develop viable urban communities, principally for low/mod persons, through decent housing, suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunity



CDBG PROGRAM NATIONAL OBJECTIVES







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CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES - ACQUISITION

- Includes land, air rights, water rights, rights of way, easements, buildings and other real property improvements.
- Purchase, long-term lease (at least 15 years), or donation.
- Carried out by the grantee or a public or private nonprofit organization.



CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES PUBLIC FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS

- Acquisition, construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or installation
- Energy efficiency improvements
- Improvements to make accessible to persons with disabilities
- Architectural design features and other treatments aimed at improving aesthetic quality (i.e., sculptures, fountains)



CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES PUBLIC FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS

- Infrastructure
 - Streets, curbs, sidewalks
 - Water, sewer
- Neighborhood facilities
 - Public schools, libraries
 - Parks, playgrounds
 - Recreational facilities
- Fire protection equipment



CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES PUBLIC FACILITIES AND IMPROVEMENTS

- Facilities for special needs populations
 - Homeless shelters, domestic violence shelters
 - Nursing homes, convalescent homes
 - Hospitals
 - Halfway houses for runaway children, drug offenders or parolees
 - Group homes for persons with disabilities
 - Day Care Centers



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CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES - HOUSING SERVICES

- Linked to services to owners, tenants, contractors, or other entities participating in the HOME program
- Housing counseling; Energy auditing
- Preparation of work specifications
- Loan processing; Inspections
- Tenant selection; Management of tenant based rental assistance programs



CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES - HOMEOWNERSHIP

- Direct homeownership assistance
- Up to 50% of required down payment
- Reasonable closing costs
- Pay the mortgage insurance premium
- Subsidizing interest rates and mortgage principal
- Finance the cost of acquiring property already occupied by the household
- Limited to low and moderate income households

CDBG PROGRAM ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES - REHABILITATION

Rental Housing

• Eligible properties:

- Publicly or privately-owned;
- Residential or mixed use



CDBG PROGRAM NEW CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSING

- Activities in support of the development of new housing may be eligible
 - Acquisition by public or nonprofit entities -570.201(a)
 - Site clearance and demolition- 570.201(d)
 - Site improvements (if in public ownership) -570.201(c)
- In return units are rented at affordable rents (rental housing) or sold (homeownership) to low to moderate income persons





SENIOR RESIDENCE AT KANEOHE - SEVENTY FOUR UNIT HUD CPD FUNDED THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES:

- \$1.09 MILLION IN CDBG FOR ACQUISITION,
- \$2.09 MILLION IN CDBG FOR INTERIM FINANCING OF NEW CONSTRUCTION,
- \$3 MILLION IN HOME FOR INTERIM FINANCING OF NEW CONSTRUCTION, AND
- \$2.24 MILLION IN HOME FOR PERMANENT FINANCING OF NEW CONSTRUCTION

FUNDING SOURCES: (\$23.8 MILLION TOTAL PROJECT COST):

HOME: \$2,962,000; CDBG: \$100,000; DEVELOPER EQUITY: \$50,000

RENTAL HOUSING TRUST FUND: \$5,500,000; TAX CREDIT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: \$1,780,000

LOW INCOME TAX CREDITS: \$9,675,489; PERMANENT LOAN: \$3,701,250

Funding Sources: (\$39.8 million): HOME, \$7.28 million; HOME Disaster, \$10.1 million;

CDBG Disaster, \$1.18 million; State of Hawaii CIP, \$3.0 million; Low Income Tax Credits, \$12.4 million; County of Kauai \$4.65 million; Private Loan: \$1.2 million.







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
