Weatherization

- Arizona' total - \$68,359,197
 - Navajo Nation - \$9,068,150 (funding from AZ and NM allocation)
 - \$57,023,278 - Department of Commerce Program.
- Training and Technical Assistance (T&TA)
Budget was increased to 20% of program funding.
 - 1.5% to DOE
 - 18.5 % to the state, split evenly between state and local.

T&TA will benefit all of us

- The good part of the state's portion of the T&TA will be used to expand the Southwest Building Science Training Center (details later).
- These facilities will be available to your organizations and trade partners.

State Energy Programs

- The State Energy Program (SEP) provides grants to states and directs funding to state energy offices from technology programs in DOE's Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy.

Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grant Program

- Funding for local governments.
 - Cities over 35,000 population and counties over 200,000 population receive funding directly from DOE. (\$54,223,900)

 - State receives \$9,593,500 for a competitive grant program for smaller communities.
