


#### Composition of distressed sales by geography





# Neighborhood stabilization: concerns over investor purchases of distressed properties


#### Who Is Buying Properties?—April 2012





# Unemployment rate in Washington continues to mirror national trend





#### Washington's house values at 2005 levels





#### House prices at metropolitan level





Note: Delinquency status of 90+ days past due or worse. Excludes first mortgage. Source: FRBNY Consumer Credit Panel


### Seattle rents up, vacancies down



### Areas Affected by Concentrated Foreclosures April 2012





# Areas at Risk of Additional Foreclosures April 2012



## Areas Affected by Concentrated Foreclosures April 2012



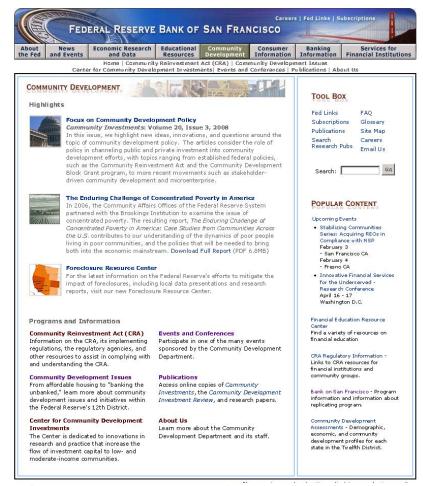
