### **Vasco da Silva Curdia**

Vasco da Silva Curdia is a Research Advisor in the Macroeconomics Research section of the Economic Research Department. He has been with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco since 2012.

Prior to that, Vasco was at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York where he served as an economist in the Macroeconomic and Monetary Studies Function of the Economic Research Department.

Vasco has published numerous articles in academic journals on macroeconomics, monetary economics and econometrics. His research primarily aims at understanding the effects of monetary policy in the economy. This includes studying how households and firms interact with financial institutions and how different actions by the central bank influence those interactions.

Vasco completed his Ph.D. and M.A. in Economics at Princeton University, and his B.A. in Economics at Universidade Nova de Lisboa, Portugal.
