Adam is a Research Advisor in the Microeconomics Research section of the Economic Research Department. He has been with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco since 2012. Prior to joining the Federal Reserve, Adam was at the Bureau of Economic Analysis in Washington, DC where he served as an economist in the Office of the Chief Economist.

Adam has taught courses in economics at UC Davis and American University and has published numerous articles in both academic and policy-oriented journals on industrial organization, health economics, and macroeconomics. Adam's research primarily aims at understanding price and inflation dynamics. This includes studying how firms compete with one another when setting prices. Adam completed his Ph.D. and M.A. in Economics at Boston University, and his B.A. in Economics and Mathematics at Columbia University.
