Daniel J. Wilson

Daniel (Dan) Wilson is an economist and Vice President, Macroeconomics and Applied Microeconomic Research, in the Economic Research department at the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco (FRBSF). Dan has a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Maryland. His fields of research include public finance, empirical macroeconomics, and applied microeconomics. Much of his research has investigated the local and national economic effects of state tax policies, including research and development tax credits, investment tax credits, and the corporate income tax. Dan also has extensively studied the effectiveness of federal government spending, particularly spending on public infrastructure. More recently, he also has been applying text analysis techniques to FOMC transcripts and speeches to study central bank preferences.



Dan's research is published or forthcoming in top economics journals such as *American Economic Review*, *Review of Economics and Statistics*, *NBER Macro Annual*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, *American Economic Journal: Economic Policy*, and *American Economic Review: Insights*. Dan taught Intermediate Macroeconomics while visiting the University of Michigan and has consulted for the IMF. He currently serves on the Board of Editors for the *American Economic Journal: Economic Policy*.
