Zheng Liu is a Vice President of International Research and the Director of the Center for Pacific Basin Studies at the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. His current research interests are macroeconomics, monetary economics, and international finance. He has published articles in peer-reviewed academic journals including *American Economic Review*, *Econometrica*, *American Economic Journal: Macroeconomics*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, *Quantitative Economics*, and *Journal of Economic Theory*. His research has been cited in US congressional testimony and by media outlets such as the Wall Street Journal, The Economist, Bloomberg, Reuters, and the Washington Post. His work on China's capital controls and monetary policy was awarded the 2016 Sun Yefang Prize, China's highest award in economics and finance.

Zheng completed his Ph.D. and M.A. in Economics at the University of Minnesota, and his B.A. and M.A. in Economics at the Renmin University of China. Prior to joining the Federal Reserve in 2008, Zheng was an Associate Professor of Economics at Emory University. He has also taught courses at Clark University, the University of Minnesota, and Shanghai Jiao Tong University. He served as a technical advisor for the IMF and a visiting scholar at the University of Minnesota, Boston University, the Federal Reserve Banks of Atlanta and Minneapolis, and the European Central Bank. Zheng currently serves as an Associate Editor of the *Quantitative Economics* and the *Journal of Economic Dynamics and Control*. He
