Andrew Foerster is a Research Advisor at the Economic Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.

Mr. Foerster joined the Bank in July 2018, having previously serving as Assistant Vice President and Economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City. He received Ph.D. and M.A. degrees in Economics from Duke University, an M.S. in Mathematical Sciences from Virginia Commonwealth University, and a B.A. in Economics from Davidson College.

Mr. Foerster's research interests are in the areas of macroeconomics and monetary policy, with focus on how different sectors interact to affect the macroeconomy, and



how expected future policy matters for current outcomes. He has published a number of papers in academic journals, and has written several articles for Federal Reserve publications.
