Zheng Liu is a Senior Policy Advisor and the Director of the Center for Pacific Basin Studies at the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. His current research interests are macroeconomics, monetary economics, international finance, and the Chinese economy. He has published articles in peer-reviewed academic journals including *American Economic Review*, *Econometrica*, *American Economic Journal: Macroeconomics*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, *Quantitative Economics*, *Journal of Economic Theory*, and *Journal of International Economics*. His research has been cited in US congressional testimony and by media outlets including the Wall Street Journal, The Economist, Bloomberg, Reuters, and the Washington Post. His work on China's capital controls and monetary policy was awarded the 2016 Sun Yefang Prize, China's highest award in economics and finance.

Zheng completed his Ph.D. and M.A. in Economics at the University of Minnesota, and his B.A. and M.A. in Economics at the Renmin University of China. Prior to joining the Federal Reserve in 2008, Zheng was an Associate Professor of Economics at Emory University. He served as a technical advisor for the IMF and a visiting scholar at the University of Minnesota, Boston University, the Federal Reserve Banks of Atlanta and Minneapolis, and the European Central Bank. He is currently a policy fellow at the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research (SIEPR). Zheng serves an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Monetary Economics* and the *Journal of Economic Dynamics and Control*. He was an Associate Editor for *Quantitative Economics* in 2019-2022 and the *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking* in 2013-2018. He is also a member of the Editorial Board of *VoxChina*.
