














# Population that is Hispanic or Latino, 2013







## Population Over Age 16 by Occupation, 2013 Central Utah












## Households that are Unbanked or Underbanked, 2014





### Housing Stock by Type, 2013 Central Utah



## Housing Stock by Year Constructed, 2013 Central Utah






